## Year 6's Newsletter - June 2022

Dear Parents

We have now entered the final term of your child's primary school experience.

With a busy term ahead, the children are bursting with excitement!

**Maths:** this term we will be continuing to work on the maths skills needed to be ready for secondary school, such as: fractions, timetables and recapping formal methods of multiplication and division.

**English:** this term we shall be completing several short units - The Magic Box, The Tale of the Three Brothers.

**Science:** this term the children will be carrying out a series of investigations based on prior knowledge of insulators and conductors and separating materials and mixtures. They will be planning fair tests, carrying out observations from which the results will inform their conclusions.

**Jigsaw:** Growing and changing - The children will be learning all about how their bodies will change through puberty and how babies are made. This will be a weekly lesson.

**PE** will continue to take place on a Tuesday and Thursday. Please ensure your child has a sun hat and sun cream on

those sunny days. As our leavers' play edges ever closer, some of our PE days may be used for play rehearsals.

### Transition to secondary school.

This time of year can be very challenging for year 6. Although the children are relieved to have completed most of their hard work, they suddenly realise this is their last term at St Michael's. Over the coming weeks, the children will be invited for transition days at their new school. In class, we will be talking about transition and how to tackle the next big step.

Year 6 will be putting on a performance of 'Goodbye my friend'. We look forward to inviting you to our performance on 12<sup>th</sup> July. I will be in touch closer to the time with more details.
